

# TWILIGHT AT BAERENDORF




## ASL SCENARIO S34

Scenario Design: Chris Olden



**BAERENDORF, FRANCE, 23 November 1944:** The thrust towards the Rhine River by the American XV Corps threatened to split the German First and Ninth Armies, which could lead to the outflanking of the Saar Basin and the destruction of German forces west of the Rhine. *Generalfeldmarschall* Gerd von Rundstedt needed armored reinforcements for a strong counterattack to prevent an Allied breakthrough. On 21 November, the Panzer-Lehr-Division was handed over to von Rundstedt and sent to Alsace for the counterattack against the advancing American forces.

### BOARD CONFIGURATION:



**VICTORY CONDITIONS:** The Germans win immediately upon exiting  $\geq 40$  VP off the south edge. Each AFV with a functioning MA exited is worth 6 VP (or 5 VP if exited without a functioning MA), each squad is worth 2 VP, each HS is worth 1 VP, and each SMC is worth 1 VP plus 1 VP per negative modifier.

### BALANCE:

☆ In the Victory Conditions, replace " $\geq 40$  VP" with " $\geq 46$  VP".



Elements of 106th Cavalry Group [ELR: 3] set up on/south-of hexrow H:




Enter on Turn 3 along the south edge:

### SPECIAL RULES:

1. Due to the approaching night, there is a +1 DRM to all IFT/TH rolls at a range of  $\geq 7$  hexes. This penalty applies to the To Hit attempt and not on the IFT on an Infantry or Area Target Type attack. It does not affect Residual FP or Interdiction and does not negate FFMO.

2. The American player may secretly record which units possess Bazookas during setup. They are revealed if the possessing unit fires them, becomes broken, or an enemy unit enters its hex.

**AFTERMATH:** Dismounted elements of the 106th Cavalry Group were deployed in Baerendorf and the woods to its west, with two M1 anti-tank guns in support. As the November dusk darkened, the *panzergrenadiere* of Panzer Lehr hit the American lines hard, probing for openings for the mixed force of panzers to exploit. The GIs had to shift more than once before the hidden anti-tank guns could engage the panzers, knocking several out. After fierce fighting the Germans were able to bypass Baerendorf, but their effectiveness had been greatly diminished.
